Curriculum in Year 10 and 11

<u>Core Curriculum – all students will study the following GCSEs:</u>

English Langauage and English Literature Mathematics Science (at least 2 GCSEs)

All students will have the choice to study:

History or Geography 3 additional preferences

Guided Curriculum

Some students will study French, Further Maths and Separate Science.

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Ambition Pathways

Our ambition for all students means that some students will study French as part of the Guided Curriculum.

This will ensure students gain strong academic qualifications and it will give them the opportunity to compete with all students nationally. With strong performance, this will give them the opportunity to access college, sixth form and all universities in the future.

Studying French will also mean that students achieve the EBacc. Further information on EBacc is available here

Recent research into the importance of character

Built in through our personal development curriculum



Character traits that underpin success in education* (as defined by the DfE) can and should be actively developed;

Demands of GCSE/BTEC/Vocational

All subjects offered at KS4 lead to a level 2 qualification.

GCSE

Progress is checked throughout the course by teachers. Examinations at the end of the course will decide the final grade of the student from 1-9.

BTECs and Vocational

Continuous Assessment (coursework) throughout the course and examinations in all subjects decide the final grade of the student. Deadlines must be met.

Attendance and a positive ATL are the MINIMUM requirements for all subjects.
